We are proud to present these awards to honor practitioners, who exemplify outstanding achievement in service to neighborhoods and their lower-income residents.

A list of Awardees will be included on the FCDA website and newsletter. FCDA wishes to showcase achievements and "best practices" of our members. Any FCDA Member may nominate/sponsor a qualified program or project by completing the Application Form. Each Award recipient, along with their nominating Member will be notified of their selection status by May 9, 2010. Awards will be presented at the FCDA Training Conference Luncheon, Friday, May 30, 2008 at the Hyatt Regency Jacksonville Riverfront, 225 E. Coastline Drive, Jacksonville, FL, (904) 588-1234.

Purpose

To recognize exemplary uses of CDBG, HOME, SHIP, and other community development funding particularly those programs that address the needs of neighborhoods and families. The judging panel will look more favorably on those projects or programs that use multiple funding sources and address neighborhood or redevelopment from a comprehensive and sustainable approach.

Eligible Applicants

Community Development projects or programs funded with CDBG, HOME, SHIP, and other community development related funds are eligible. FCDA members are encouraged to nominate nonprofit sub-recipients programs or projects that operate in low-income neighborhoods or serve low income populations that are examples of "best practices" and their achievements.

Nomination Process
